

## Richard Lin

Richard Lin Show Yu (1933-2011) was born in Taiwan. From 1952 to 1958, he studied architecture and art in the UK at the Polytechnic of Central London (now the University of Westminster), and developed his own unique minimalist style throughout the 60s and 70s.

In the period after holding a solo exhibition at the Institute of Contemporary Art (ICA) in London in 1958, Lin began to experiment with his creative style. In his early days, he employed abstract expressionism combined with the Chinese philosophical connotations of Eastern thinking. He used inky black flowing brushstrokes to depict his own artistic impression of Chinese landscapes.

In the 1960s, when the modern art movement was booming, Lin developed his sense of Zen space in the 'White Series.' He was a pioneer: with his simple use of colors, pure form, condensed yet rigorous style, he was well-known in the European art world for his extreme devotion to minimalism.

In 1964, he represented the UK at Documenta III in Kassel, Germany, the first artist in Chinese history to be exhibited there, cementing his international reputation. His 'painting reliefs' of this period used simple geometric shapes and added industrial materials such as aluminum copper plate and organic glass to reveal novel, harmonious yet pure imagery.

In 1967, Richard LIN was selected alongside Chu Teh-Chun, Zao Wou-Ki, Chuang Che, HU Chi-Chung, and Walasse TING for the 44th Carnegie International in Pittsburgh, USA.

Since Richard LIN's solo exhibition at Gimpel Fils Gallery in 1959, he began to gain prominence. Mark Rothko and Lucio Fontana both visited his studio, and in 1960, Sam Francis also paid a visit. In 1966, the Spanish master Joan Miró praised LIN's ability to master white, remarking, "In the world of white, no one can compare you."Miró even sketched two drawings on an album casually, commemorating their mutual admiration. In his early thirties, Richard LIN had already established himself in international art exhibitions alongside the world's most renowned artists, which was a rare achievement.

In 1983, the National Palace Museum in Taipei broke its tradition of only collecting classical works by collecting LIN's "Modern Painting Double Relief", making it the first modern art piece and the first work by a living artist to enter the museum's collection. This reflects LIN's esteemed status in the art world. Richard LIN passed away in Taiwan in 2011, leaving behind a brilliant and distinguished legacy as a representative artist of Chinese abstract art.






